

## **CAMP KANZA, Atchison, KS**

Camp Kanza Fees: Due to increasing costs it is necessary to charge a fee to Troops outside of Atchison. The fee is \$2.50 per camper up to a maximum of \$50. Reservations are made through Larry Grantham at [grantham1@allegiance.tv](mailto:grantham1@allegiance.tv) or by phone at 913.360.3084. The number of campers and a check for the fee is to be mailed to Larry Grantham, 721 Miller Ave., Atchison, KS 66002. Checks need to be received at least one week prior to arrival. No refunds. If you have more than originally planned, the additional fees will be collected at check-in. Make arrangements with Larry to get the keys. Make out checks out payable to "Camp Kanza".

### **General Camp Rules and Procedures**

1. The outdoor code shall be observed at all times. The Scout Oath and out Law should be practiced by all scouts whenever at the camp.
2. Use of Camp Kanza shall be by reservation. Reservations shall be made one week in advance for camp outs. Use of the camp for Troop, Pack, Den and Patrol meetings is encouraged with a minimum 48 hours notice. Reservations may be made thru (Larry Grantham by calling (913) 360-3084, email [grantham1@allegiance.tv](mailto:grantham1@allegiance.tv) . He will provide a key to the camp and shelter house, as needed. All persons and groups using the camp are expected to leave all facilities and equipment in the same or better condition as they found it.
3. NO TREES ARE TO BE CUT DOWN EXCEPT UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF AN ADULT LEADER WITH PRIOR PERMISSION OF THE CAMP MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE! Pre-cut firewood and downed timber is available for campfires. Any cutting which is done shall be flush with the ground and leave no stump or stob. NO FIREWOOD SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE CAMP!
4. Fires will be built only in designated camp-site areas. No fires shall be left unattended. Whenever the camp site is left for activities, leaving the fire unattended, it shall be extinguished. Colman type fuel may be used when supervised by an adult leader at the camp site. Proper fire safety is to be practiced at all times. When camp is broken, low impact camping practices will be observed by returning the fire sight to its original condition.
5. NO FIREARMS, including handguns, rifles, shotguns, BB Guns, bow & arrows, ammunition, pellet guns, sling shots, blow guns, or any other weapon are permitted in the camp. On prior approval of the camping committee, a demonstration of any of these devices by a qualified person or group may be permitted.
6. NO ALCOHOL OR ILLEGAL DRUGS AND OTHER CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES WILL BE ALLOWED IN OR AROUND THE CAMP! Adult leaders with scouts are responsible for them and their actions.
7. NO FIREWORKS of any kind are allowed in the camp. On prior approval of the camping committee, a demonstration of any of these devices by a qualified person or group may be permitted.
8. There will be an adult leader (registered Scouter or other adult approved by the unit leader) in camp with the scouts whenever they are in the camp.
9. Use of the camp is restricted to only registered members of the Boy Scouts of America and their guests.
10. The service roads within the camp area are to be used for emergency vehicle access to the camp. It is strongly requested that vehicular traffic be kept to a minimum. The preferred use of the vehicle is to move equipment in at the start of camp and out at the end of camp. Otherwise, vehicles should be kept in the lower parking area. If any member of the unit is physically impaired and unable to walk in the camp area, a vehicle designated for that purpose may be used.
11. Trash and garbage will be kept in plastic bags or cans while in camp. Upon leaving the camping area, all trash and waste shall be taken out of the camp. Nothing is to be dumped or buried in the camp site or any place in the camp.
12. Scouts are reminded that private property surrounds the camp. No trespassing on private property is permitted.
13. Any First Class or Star Scout may do a service project at the camp for advancement with approval of the camp master and his unit leader.

#### WATER SAFETY REGULATIONS

1. SWIMMING, BOATING AND CANOEING GENERAL IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE POND. With prior approval of the Camping Committee and a CERTIFIED LIFEGUARD ON DUTY, limited water activities may be permitted. At all times during approved water activities, Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat must be observed.

#### FISHING REGULATIONS

1. Fishing for all species is permitted only as part of activities at camp such as troop campouts or such scouting sponsored events. All Kansas Fishing regulations apply.
2. The pond has been stocked and monitored for fishing quality by Kansas Fish and Game. No fish from other sources shall be introduced into the pond!
